



RESTORATION OF CIVIL RIGHTS

Q: How do I know if my rights have been restored?

A: If you are unsure if your rights have been restored, please contact your parole officer or the Division of Probations & Parole in Frankfort at (502) 564-4221.

Q: How do I get pardoned by the Governor's office?

A: You must first submit an Application for Restoration of Civil Rights. You can find that application online at www.corrections.ky.gov or you can contact the Election Center to request an application. The phone number for the Election Center is 574-6100 or email us at elections@JeffersonCountyClerk.org

Q: What must I do in order to vote?

A: If your rights have been restored, you must provide a copy of the Restoration of Civil Rights pardon by the Governor's office (it has the gold seal) along with a new voter registration card to register to vote.

Q: What if I've mailed my application, but haven't gotten anything back?

If you mailed your application you must contact the Division of Probation & Parole at (502) 564-4221 for the status of your request.

Q: What if my record has been expunged?

A: If your record has been expunged our office must have a copy of the court signed Expungement, along with a new voter registration card to vote.

*Please note that the Jefferson County clerk's Office and the Election Center are not affiliated with the Division of Probation & Parole. Neither the Jefferson County Clerk's Office nor the Election Center has the authority to restore Civil Rights.
